

When I am in the Hospital with COVID-19

I might not be allowed to have visitors at the hospital. This is so that I don't give the virus to other people.






The doctors and nurses at the hospital will give me the right medicines and treatment to make me better.





The nurses will also help me eat, go to the bathroom, and take a bath or a shower.




The nurses will call someone I know to tell them how I am doing in the hospital.

I might need a special machine to help me breathe. This is called a ventilator. I will be asleep when the ventilator is helping me to breathe.








When I start to get better, I will not need a ventilator or an oxygen mask.
